

Vatican News

The Vatican will be having a Synod 2023 on the Church to be more synodal. This means all the faithful to dialogue, give input on Church issues, not just the hierarchy to be the sole thinkers. We journey together as a way of being Church, including those who have left the Church. Their voice needs to be heard. The Vatican will be sending out a questionnaire to all parishioners through the diocese. Your feedback will be sent back to the Vatican by April 2022. Anonymity will be respected. This feedback will be reflected upon at the 2023 Synod by all bishops in the world.

Eucharist

The denying of Holy Communion to Catholics is an uncomfortable place the bishops find themselves in today. For decades it seems the question has been ignored. But what is Church teaching on this issue. Those denied Holy Communion:

- 1. Invalid marriages (Matthew. 19:9; Mark 10:11; Luke 16:18)
- 2. Those in mortal sin
- 3. Those in serious dissent against church teachings.

The Church does not see itself as denying Holy Communion to anyone, but rather people have excluded themselves from Communion by serious sin.

National News

Bishops are urging pathways to citizenship for "Dreamers" (DACA). Children born in the U.S. of illegal parents living in America. Bishops noted during the COVID-19 pandemic, 200,000 DACA recipients served as essential workers, yet they live with rejection and uncertainty of our broken immigration system. It is time for some immigration reforms.

Facts about the Archbishop Annual Appeal

On an annual basis, each Parish is assessed an Archbishop Annual Appeal amount equal to 20% of that Parish's first collection for the year. This amount must be paid by the Parish regardless of what is actually contributed by the people of the Parish. That is why it is important for people to understand the importance of making a contribution or pledge to the AAA each year.

For St. Isabella's the 2020 AAA assessment totaled \$93,459 and we received Parish contributions of \$61,445. Therefore we were short \$32,014. For 2021, our assessment was \$82,827 and we have received Parish donations and pledges of \$19,978. So, we are currently short \$62,849. We recently received notice that the 2020 and 2021 shortfalls will have to be paid.

In total, for the two years we owe \$94,863. Given the fact that these amount will need to be paid, we are asking that each Parishioner that is able to make a contribution consider doing so in the coming weeks. Our goal is to pay down as much as possible by year-end, so we can minimize the amount we need to take from our operating funds in order to pay-off the AAA from past years.

We certainly understand that not everyone is in a position to make a contribution. Please consider what you can contribute as a small contribution by everyone in our Parish community can make up this shortfall.
