

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

John 6:51 – 58

We celebrate Eucharist on Holy Thursday evening, so why do we have a second celebration, Corpus Christi. There have been many heresies in church history surrounding the Eucharist. This 2nd celebration is to remind Catholics of our teaching that the Eucharist of the Son of God, instituted by Christ, is about what Christ said, my Body and Blood present at the Supper of the Lamb.

Catechesis


