Matthew 13: 1-23



The parable of the sower accounts for the early church's experience of meeting the challenges and the failures. The sower also had a hard life. So the beginning of the faith was met with persecutions, worldly preoccupation, and shallow mindlessness. All the obstacles that frustrated the beginning of the grow of the Christian Faith.


THANK YOU
