

Synod (Part 3 of 4)

The Latin word for Synod is Council. The greatest being Ecumenical Councils. All Bishops by ordination have the function of governing, sanctifying and teaching in communion with the Pope. This is known as Collegiality. Bishops working together under the Pope . This means the Pope is not a power beholden to nobody or to doctrines. He is a member of the Collegiate, but as the Vicar of Christ. The Synod is an expression of this. Bishops working in unison working with the Pope in leading the Church.

Which Pope had the shortest reign? Pope Stephen II, 752 A.D. He died four days after being elected. He died of a stroke. He was never consecrated a Pope therefore under Canon Law, he is not recognized as a Pope and is not on the listing of Popes.

Saint Thomas Aquinas was enroute to the Council when he died on the way. 500 Bishops attended.


