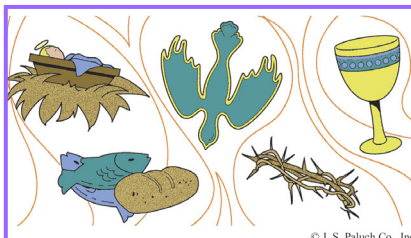

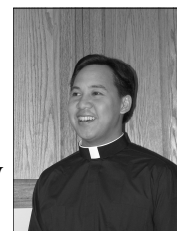

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
Listen and Follow...



“This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.” And listen they did. From that moment on, Peter, James and John became ardent followers of Jesus, forsaking everything to follow in His footsteps. Like the psalmist crying, “O Lord, I am your servant,” the three disciples committed themselves to lives on incredible hardship and indescribable joy. After that day on the mountain, they never waived in their choice to follow the Lord.

Although our tests of faith may not be as severe as Abraham’s and our peak experiences are not as dramatic as the Transfiguration, we all face the daily challenges of walking “before the Lord in the land of the living.” As we follow our varied calls to love and serve, let us be comforted by Paul’s reminder to the Romans: “If God is for us, who can be against us?”

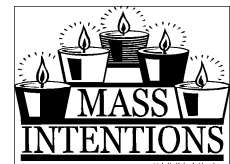

LENTEN DISCIPLINES

Abstinence — Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fast — Everyone eighteen years of age and older, but under the age of sixty, is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days, the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.
