Fourth Sunday of Easter

John 10 : 11 - 18



The title that Jesus ascribed to himself is the Good Shepherd. He does not say a prince of the church or administrator or chairman. He uses a pastoral term that underlies his mission, the caring of souls. The investment of one's life in putting people first in all matters, even above self as shepherds do for their sheep. A pastor supposedly is also to be a good shepherd to his flock.

I have spent all my life listening to people. Secularists, Atheists, Muslims, Ecumenists, Catholics and so on. This is what Synod is doing without compromising doctrine.

Synod (Part 1 of 3)

The word Synod is of Greek origin. It means a kind of walking together towards a common goal. October 4th to October 28th, 2024, the Synod will conclude in Rome. Calling a Synod together of the worldwide Church is the most important event of Pope Francis pontificate. 2 ½ years ago, parishioners were asked of their experiences of parish life and concerns for the Church. These were sent to the Vatican for discernment. The next phase, Bishops, Sisters, Religious came to discuss the input. October 2024, Pope Francis will make a final document on what the Synod has come up with.

Vatican Facts

Which Cardinal spoke 39 languages? Giuseppe Caspar Mezzofanti, Bologna, 1774 A.D. It became a hobby of his. Eleven other languages he also spoke but not fluently. He also could read nineteen other languages but not speak them. That is 69 in total. Considered the greatest linguist of all time. He said Basque was the most difficult language, Italian the most beautiful, and Gaelic the harshest vocally.

Church Councils

First Council of Lyons, 1245 A.D. By this time, the Papacy was very powerful in temporal affairs and ownership of lands. Emperors and kings became increasingly anxious of Church authority over secular affairs. This Council was called to mediate on this. The decrees issued.

1. The Church will maintain her proper position in ecclesiastical and temporal matters
 2. The Emperor Frederick to be deposed
 3. To militarily defend the Church against the Muslim taifas
 4. To address the strife in the Holy Land
- No Church reforms were issued
