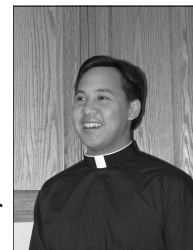

From the Pastor

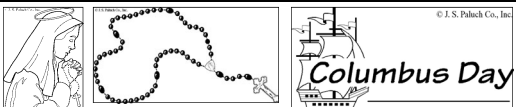
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

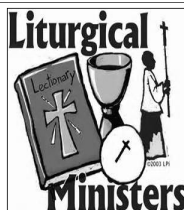

Voting is a basic right of every U.S. citizen. Registration is available in several languages: English, Spanish, Thai, Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Tagalog and Vietnamese.

You are eligible to vote if: You are a U.S. citizen, a resident of California, 18 years of age or old, and not in prison or on parole for a felony.
