

Catechism

Are all sins forgiven no matter how heinous? Yes, except the sin against the Holy Spirit, that is the sin of an unrepentant sinner, who does not want forgiveness or acknowledge sin in their lives. This kind of spirit has decided no matter how bad is bad, there is nothing to change in my life, and no God is touching my soul.

Weddings

Many young people ask why can't I get married outside of a church building and have my wedding in my family's garden? Diocese of Baltimore is now allowing this to offset declining Catholic weddings. The results, their weddings have increased by 31%. Wedding at sea are not allowed. All other diocese in the U.S. do not allow weddings on secular grounds.

Sacrament of the Sick (Part 3 of 4)

Last rites is mentioned in Scripture, Letter of James 5:14–15, so this last Sacrament goes back to the earliest days of Church life. It is a Sacrament to face we are dying not looking for a miracle to live. Christ conquered sin and death. We too shall share in his victory. It is the preparation of passing over to eternal life. The Sacrament can be repeated if the person remains ill.

Ukraine

The unfortunate blood bath against Ukraine continues. Stalin saw Ukraine as separate from Russia. He granted Ukraine membership in the United Nations. Ukraine is a sovereign State, with its own language, traditions, culture and citizens. They have their own identity and want no ties to Russian communism. Millions of Ukrainians have been persecuted by Czars, Communists for centuries. 20% of the population is Catholic. May this oppressive insanity soon end.

Mental Illness

Mental illness is now a concern and big focus in society especially with youth. Anxiety, depression is common in high schools, complicated by social issues, racism, violence, sexism, addictions and social media. A lot of pressure for a young mind to handle, The pressure of academics is intense enough. Suicidal thoughts is up than ten years ago. Usual indicators of a crisis pending—isolation, not sleeping enough, behavioral changes, not studying can be signs of mental illness. Quality care cannot be ignored to our teenagers. They deserve our attention.
